Union Hall is pleased to present *Matter is Minimum*, the first exhibition from the multidisciplinary project *They Rage*, organized by photographer Summer Taylor and facilitator Shammai Mading. *They Rage* began as a collaborative project aimed at examining the ubiquitous nature of anger, and understanding the complexities of processing this emotion in relation to individual's backgrounds and experiences. *They Rage* focuses on four core questions posed to both participants in, and viewers of, their work:

- 1. How would you define anger?
- 2. How has anger shown up in your life?
- 3. How have different experiences in your life impacted your relationship to anger?
- 4. How has your community or society viewed your anger?

*Matter is Minimum* showcases images and audio developed during the summer of 2020, when *They Rage* conducted a series of interviews with Black and Brown women and non-binary people in Denver, leading them through four core questions and creating a supportive space to document the individual experience of relating to their anger. The selection of images displayed in the *Matter is Minimum* exhibition, shared with consent of the subjects, aims to allow viewers access to this vulnerable space and stimulate questions about how their own race, gender presentation , and privilege affects expression of their anger and the way their anger is perceived. While the project took shape as a result of the national social dialogue around race, police brutality, and injustice, it reaches beyond these conversations: re-visioning rage as a starting point for radical change.
